In 1998 we conducted a special panel-of-experts program discussing the extinction of Mammoth in conjunction with the National Society for American Archaeology's first-ever meeting in Seattle, Washington. In April 2003 we were involved in an international Wetlands Archaeological Research Programs conference entitled: Wet Sites Connections—Linking Indigenous Histories, Archaeology and the Public (us!) bringing international archaeologists together to discuss waterlogged/wet archaeological sites from around the world in Olympia, Washington.
